Anna K. Kadlec, 97, died Friday at Madison Manor.

Mrs. Kadlec was a native of Chicago, Ill.

A 1917 graduate of the University of Chicago, she became interested in social work and was a protegee of Nobel Peace Prize winner Jane Addams of Chicago's Hull House.

Mrs. Kadlec became a mediator between labor and management in the packing industry during World War I.

She later taught in the Chicago Public School System for over 25 years. Upon retirement, she moved to Richmond, where she continued to teach at Model Laboratory School until she was 70 years old.

Mrs. Kadlec was the widow of Chicago physician Dr. Frank Kadlec.

She is survived by two daughters, Dr. Nancy Finlay-Runkel of Richmond and Bonnie Hartley-Linse of Portland, Ore.; three

grandsons, John T. Finlay of Louisville, Robert and Franklin Hartley of Portland, Ore.

Her body has been donated to the University of Kentucky Medical School.
